#### **Methodology**



Survey fielded on the KnowledgePanel® from August 18 – September 1, 2025.

Survey fielded using RDD Telephone from August 18 – September 4, 2025.



Sample of 5,489 American adults aged 18 or older, with 4,889 interviews taking place online, and 600 interviews via telephone.



For the online portion, the survey was conducted using the probability-based lpsos KnowledgePanel®. Fielded in both English and Spanish.

The RDD Telephone portion was conducted in English in the Native American Lands and Aging Farmlands.

The data was weighted to U.S. Census Targets in each area segment and at the national level.






#### Future of the United States over the next few years (% hopeful)




#### Access in community – Fruits and vegetables






Q6: How easy or difficult are the following things to access for you personally in your community? Base: All Respondents (n= 5,489)

#### Access in community - Meat, fish, tofu, eggs, or other protein






#### Access in community - Clean water to drink






#### Access in community - Safe, affordable housing





#### Access in community - Affordable healthcare








#### Importance to Having A Good Life – Education after high school






## Importance to Having A Good Life – Earning a college Bachelor's degree






## Importance to Having A Good Life – Earning a post-grad degree






#### **Familiarity with Generative Al Platforms**






#### Generative Al usage in the past two weeks
